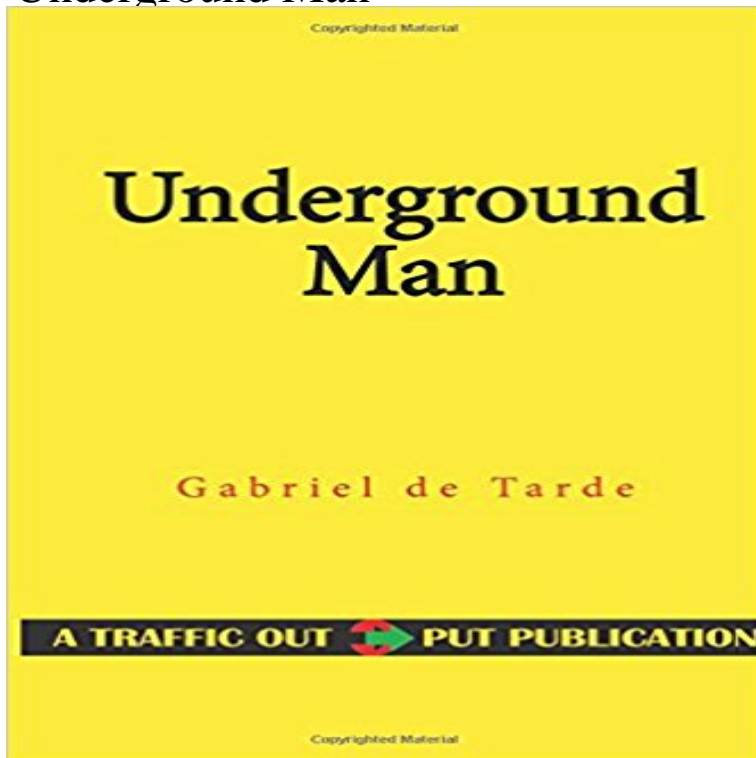


Underground Man
