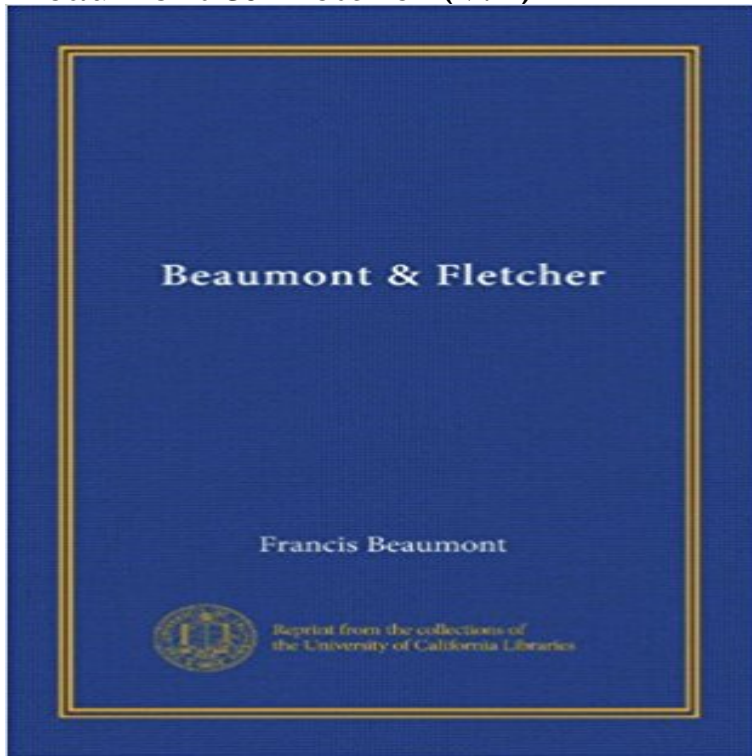


Beaumont & Fletcher (v.2)
