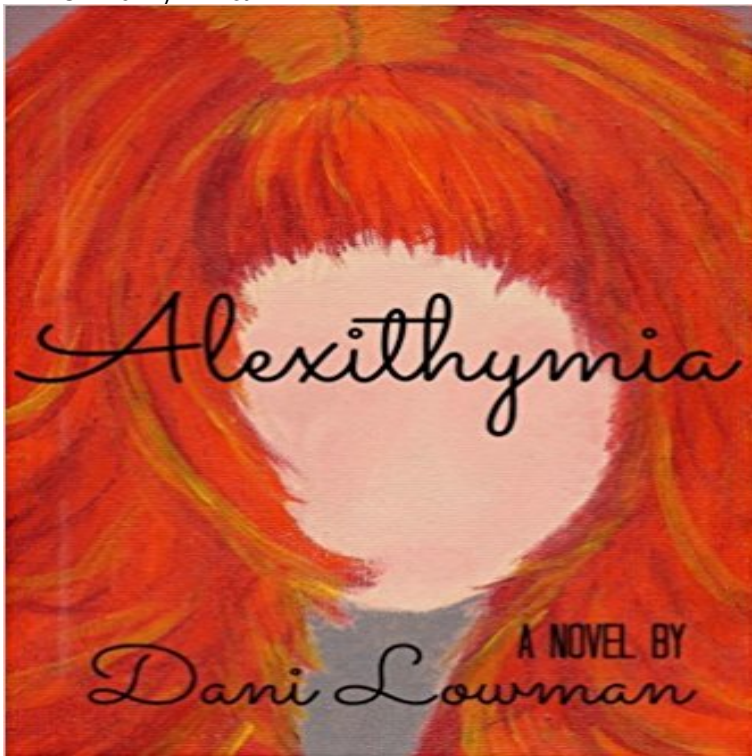


Alexithymia
