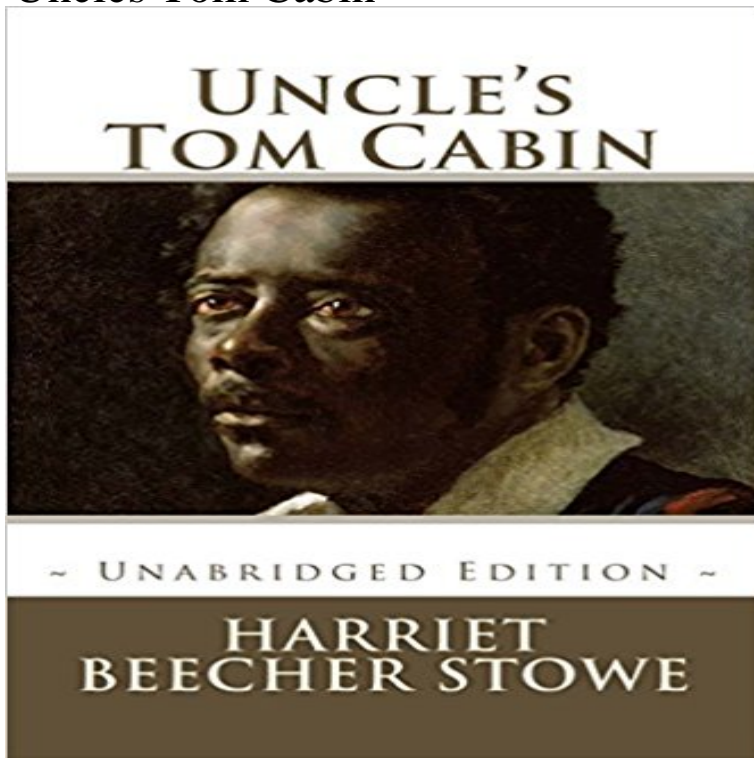


Uncles Tom Cabin
