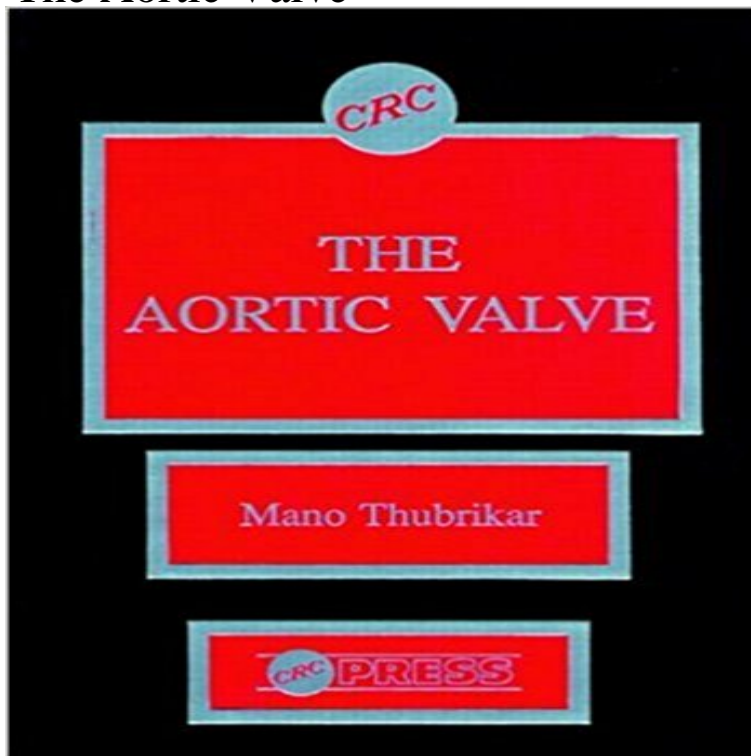


# The Aortic Valve
