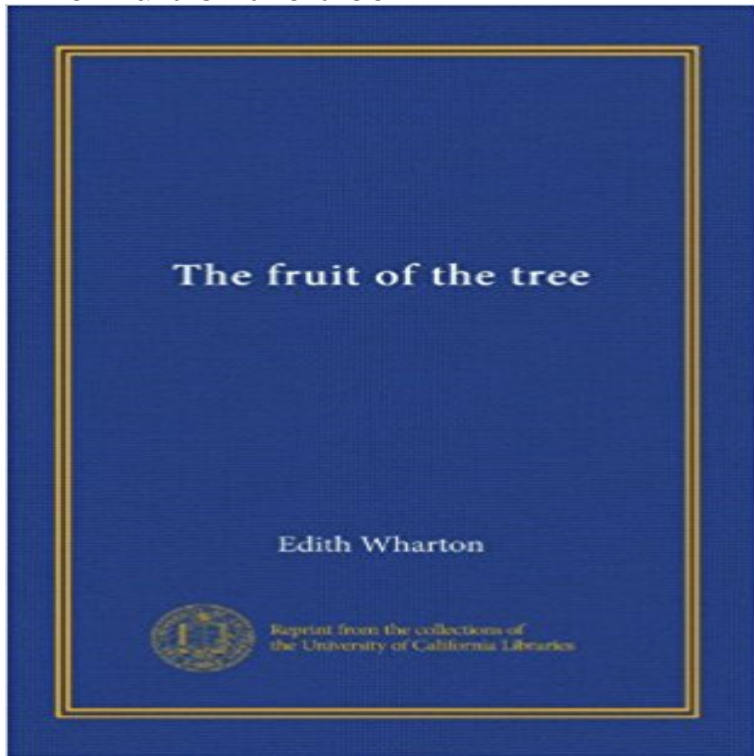


## The fruit of the tree
