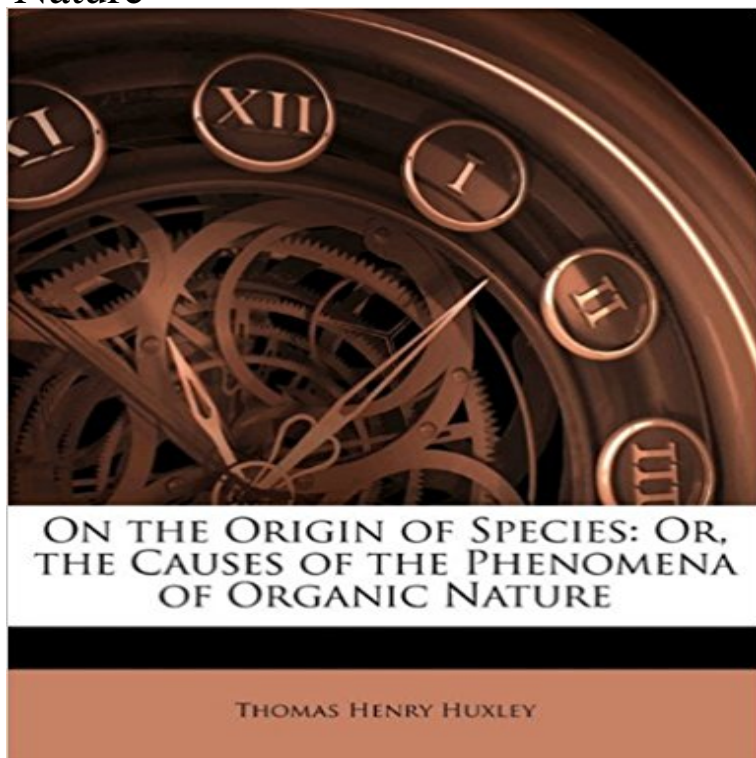


# On the Origin of Species: Or, the Causes of the Phenomena of Organic Nature
